# Some things can change:

November 27<sup>th</sup> you will see some of the prayers at Mass signed a bit differently! Why? To bring unity throughout the world. Now all the countries which use English will use the same words. These words will be closer to the original text and Scripture.

When the priest says, "The Lord be with you.", instead of signing "And also with you." it will be "And with your spirit." (Did you know that Spanish and German people have been using that for years?!)

The Penitential Act, the Gloria, the Creed, and the response before Communion will be a little different.

For Hearing people, the words will sound very different.

Begotten, consubstantial, incarnate, oblation...these are words not used very often in English, but they were chosen carefully because of what they mean. They are highly technical and their meaning is important. They will help your understanding of the Mass to deepen.

For Deaf people, the meaning will be seen in different signing.

Don't be afraid.

Pay attention. Heaven and earth meet...at Mass.



# Some things don't change:

God has a plan for marriage. [See the box below.]

This summer New York State declared that homosexuals can marry. Did God's plan did not change in 2011? No! Does that mean that God hates homosexuals? No! He made them and loves them. He died for them. They are special, and meant for special things...but marriage is not one of them. They are the same as everyone and called to practice the virtue of chastity. [See box below.]

If they are not to engage in sexual activity, the same as other single people are not, what is God's plan for them? What special and important things does God want them to do for our world and our Church?!

God's Plan for Marriage: Marriage unites a man and a woman to have children and care for them. Marriage helps to overcome self-absorption, egoism, pursuit of one's own pleasure, and to open oneself to the other, to mutual aid and to self-giving.

Virtue is moral excellence. **Chastity** is the virtue that directs our sexuality toward authentic love and away from using persons as objects for sexual pleasure.

# **Ordinary Time: Autumn**

A Sense of the Season

All of our days are numbered. Now that Christ has risen from the dead and ascended into heaven, we count down the days until he returns in glory to judge the living and the dead. Ordinary Time is "ordinal" time: numbered days, days in which we lay out the scriptures and the prayers to bide our time until Christ returns.

Although the church makes no official distinction between the days of Ordinary Time from Pentecost until Advent, in our lives we experience the subtle shift from the relaxed days of summer to the increasingly active days of autumn. For some of us, the shift comes with the end-of-summer holiday or the beginning of school. Others see work activities shift, from tending to harvesting, from stocking shelves to increasing sales, from cashing out an old fiscal year to digging into a new one.

The church's calendar contains some subtle shifts, too. On September 14 we celebrate the Holy Cross, and the waning of the natural world around us points us to the mystery of suffering and redemption. At the end of September we invoke the holy archangels to guard us in the encroaching twilight. And if we listen closely to the scriptures in October, we begin to hear talk of the last days and the final things. These thoughts reach their culmination with the great festival of saints and souls, November 1 and 2. And we spend November remembering the dead, preparing for the end and celebrating Christ, the firstfruits harvested of the new creation, the firstborn from the dead.

This is the extraordinary opportunity that autumn's Ordinary Time opens up for us.

### October 7th is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

Do you have a rosary? It is made of beads strung together in a certain order. A particular prayer is said on each bead. There are 5 sets of 10 beads or 5 decades in the rosary (a "decade" is 10 of something). A single bead separates each decade. That single bead, is for the Our Father. Each of the 10 beads is the Hail Mary. At the beginning of each decade we remember a special time in the life of Jesus or Mary.
